A View from County Hall



At the end of January, we had what is probably our most important executive meeting of the year where we set the budget. This will be the fourth budget for the North Yorkshire Council and is set in the context of a new funding arrangement for local government with a three year settlement. The reforms have seen significant funding moved away from rural councils towards those with higher deprivation levels. The funding from government, on a like-for-like basis, has seen a reduction of just under £20m in 2026/27 and the increases projected in spending power are entirely attributable to increases in local council tax. The recommendations made by the executive, will progress to our full council meeting at the end of this month. This is usually our liveliest meeting of the year where elected members fight their corner to highlight what they see as council priorities.

We desperately await national reform to Adult Social Care including fair pay for care and for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) which sits in my portfolio and as such, close to my heart. The rapid increase in people entering this service provision has necessitated providing significant growth to these budgets. In Children's services alone we have had to provide £15m for high-cost placements. The eagerly awaited reforms to SEND may provide some relief however constant delays are leading to uncertainty.

Staying within Children's services, we are also lobbying government to address the disparity of funding arrangements to schools across the country. North Yorkshire Council is a member of the f40 group - a coalition of the UK's 43 lowest-funded local authorities. What this means is that the difference between our funding and that of the highest-funded areas is enormous, with the highest-funded local authority receiving £14,181 per pupil compared with just £9,299 in North Yorkshire. For children with SEND, North Yorkshire gets - £1,114 per pupil compared with £3,831 and this can't be fair. The number of children with Educational Health Care Plans (EHCPs) in the county is rising rapidly from 1,700 in 2015 to more than 6,200 in 2026. Looking at these figures spells out the urgency for equity across the country and reforms to the SEND funding. This is a national issue and one that is putting all councils under significant financial pressure.

Last year the LGC reported that the government was expecting up to 74 councils across the country to apply for exceptional financial support for 2026/27 in order to avoid issuing section 114 notices, in effect bankruptcy. NYC has avoided this situation in part through the savings made as a result of moving into a unitary authority however, Despite these savings, the Budget for 2026/27 still requires a contribution from Reserves of £17.0m and this is clearly unsustainable over the long term. The forecast cumulative High Needs deficit for North Yorkshire which supports children with SEND, would reach approximately £24m by 31 March 2026 and potentially £40m by March 2027 without reform or any measures to mitigate. Ultimately, if reform is further delayed there is the real potential for NYC to join the 74 councils

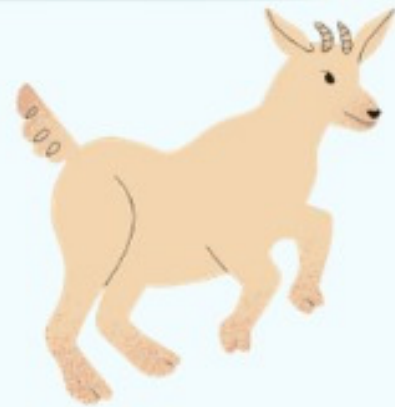

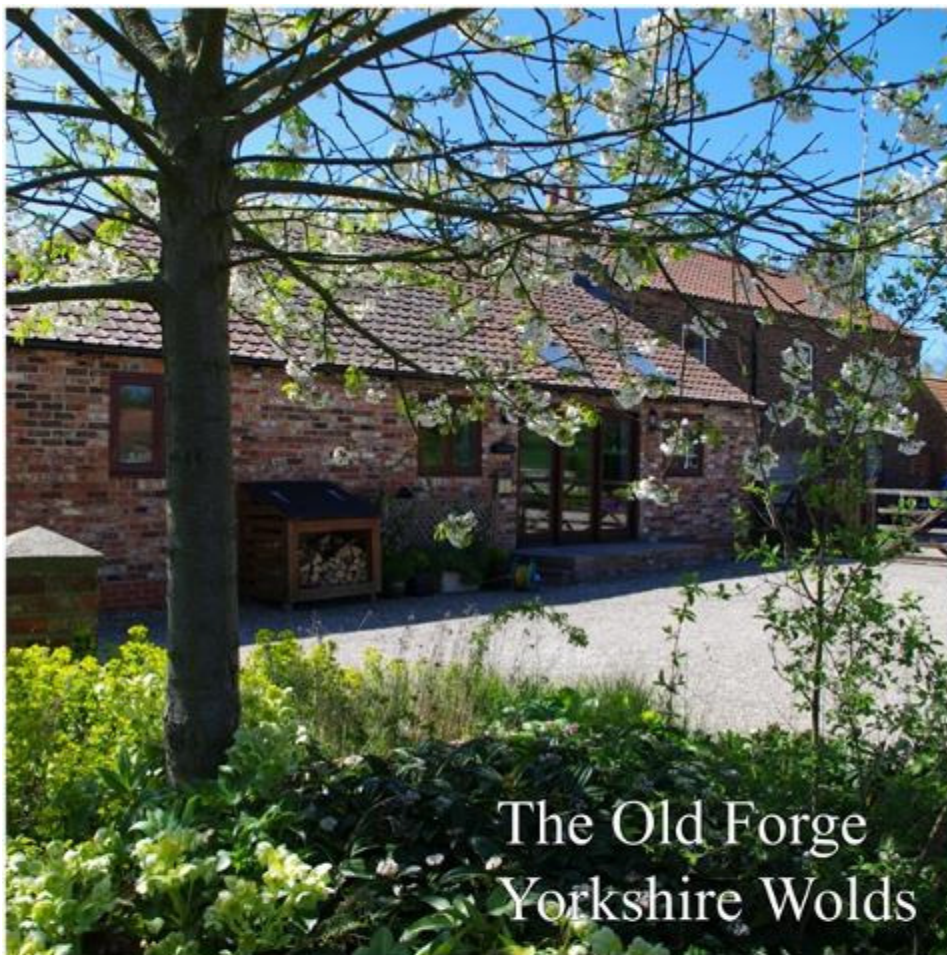

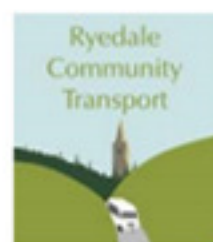
