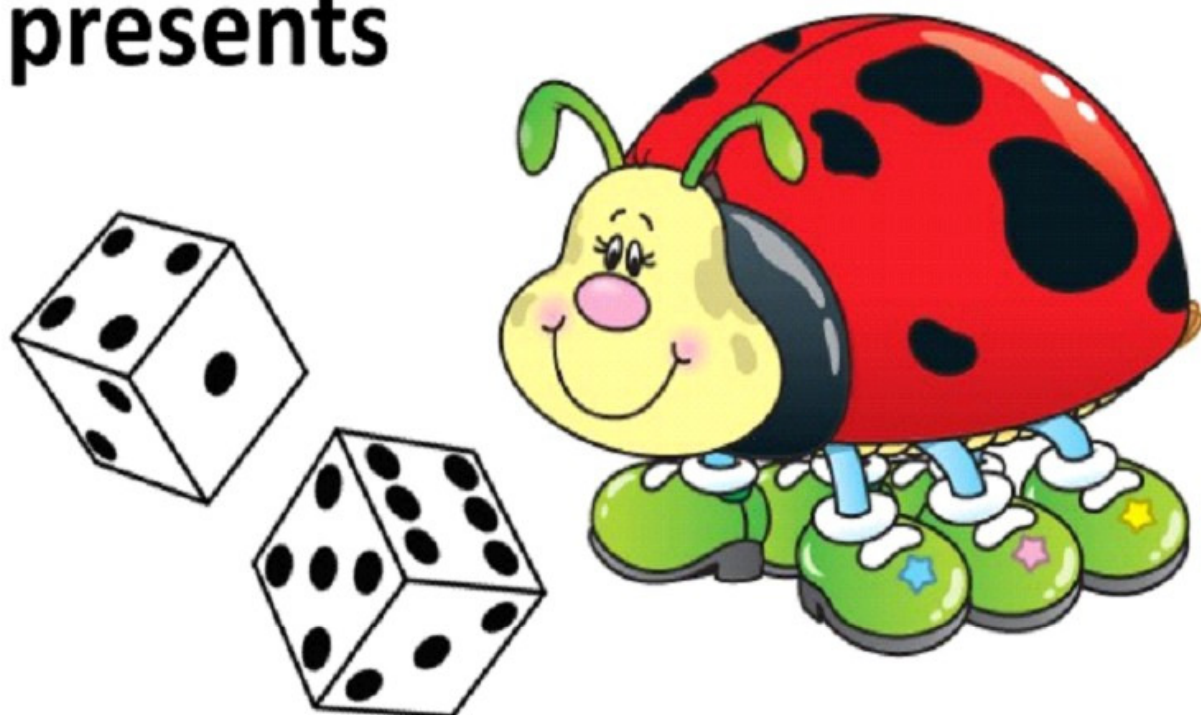

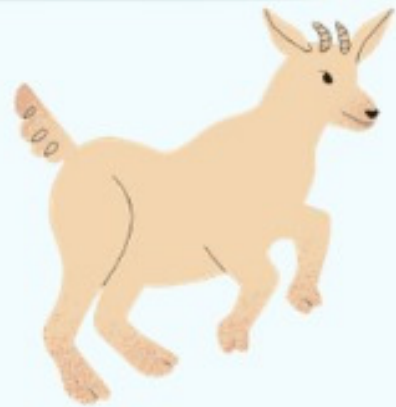

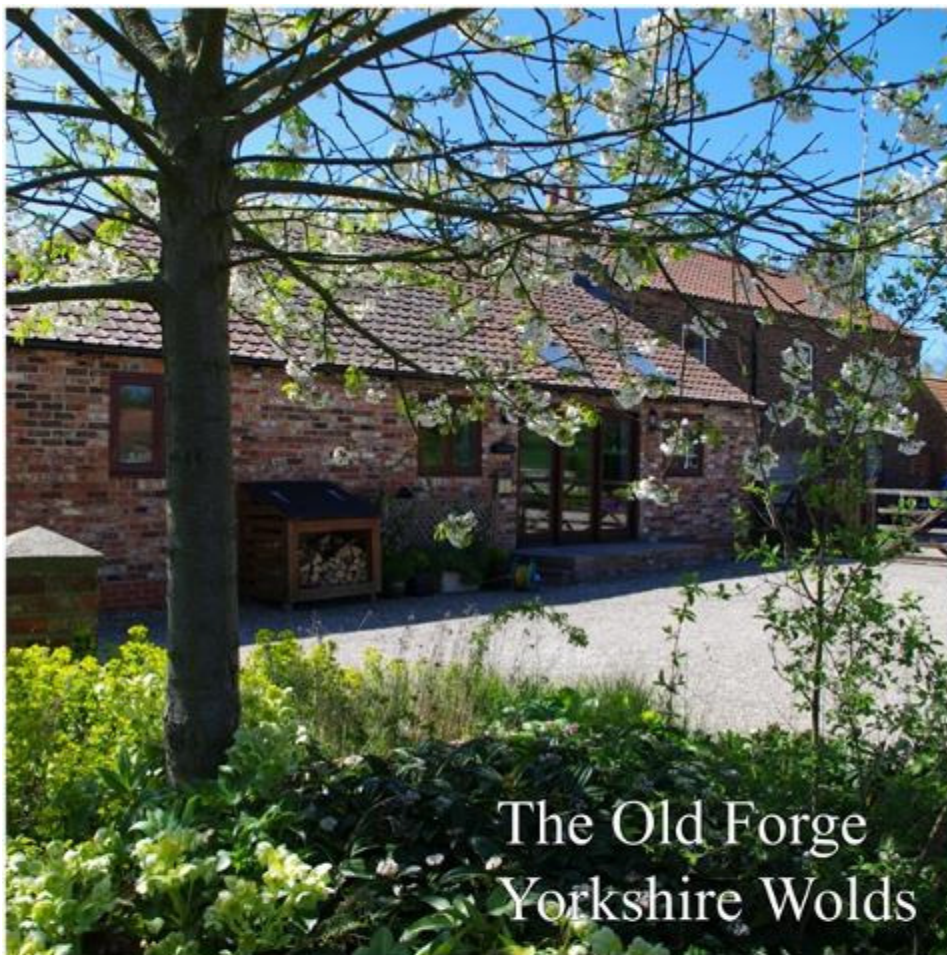

*An occasional series from a local birder
and sound recordist.*



The understanding of bird movement / migration carries a pace ... just heard about Motus stations ... specialised receivers for radio telemetry to track the movement of birds ... bats ... insects ... Two records were of great interest ... two jack snipe ... they were tagged at Ottenby bird observatory Sweden ... October 2025 ... passed through Denmark ... crossed the North Sea at one of the widest parts ...

pinged the receiver at RSPB Saltholme Cleveland ... one the 7th Nov ... the other on the 9th Nov ... one had taken 50 days to make the journey ... the other 71 days ... which doesn't seem quite right ..? they had travelled some 1247 km ... both this year birds ... so both out into the big wild for the first time ...

Jack snipe ... binomial ... *lymnocryptes minimus* ... Greek limne + cryptos = marsh + hidden and Latin for smallest ... were regulars on a previous marshy patch ... down south ... smaller than snipe ... shorter bill ... you virtually had to step on them before they took flight ... a roundabout flight before a quick drop into cover ... main identification was a pair of yellow braces across their back ... that's if you could see them in the blur of their acceleration away ... a silent take off rather than a snipes squelch ... heady days from a past time ...

One for the calendar ... the RSPB Big Garden Watch ... 23rd-24th January 2026 ... bird watch for one hour ... tea and biscuits can be included ... details and sign up on line ... RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch ...

Local patch ... Fieldfare 250+ ... redwing 50+ ... yellowhammer 80+ ... goldfinch 40+ ... buzzards ... sparrow hawk with a blackbird ... kestrel ... Siskin ... redpoll ... red kites in the Wintringham area ... and reports of two red kites local to the patch ...

Thanks to a local for a cracking photo of a kestrel ... stay safe ...

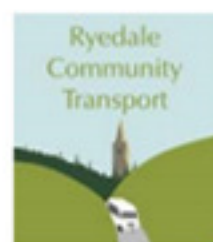
