A View from County Hall



I have good news to report this month! In February, I highlighted the 74 councils that had been forced to apply for exceptional finance support, in part driven by the deficit caused by exceptional numbers of children requiring Educational Health Care Plans. The government have now pledged to commit £5b of funding nationally to deal with the imminent financial situation. This will cover 90% of the debt for one year. NYC's share of this would amount to £22m which is welcome news, however I do have a couple of reservations. Firstly, £5b is unlikely to cover the national debt, so will the promise convert to cash? Secondly, unless government address the issue causing the debt, giving us promised reform to the SEND system, then we will be in the exact same position next year and there is no commitment to addressing the shortfall going forward.

No council can ever be perfect, moving from eight councils into one has had its challenges and I don't think anyone truly anticipated the level of work for both officers and elected members. We took advice from other authorities before making the transition, however no other authority had dealt with such a large geography as North Yorkshire. We are still learning, developing and improving service delivery. We were therefore delighted when IMPOWER's league tables on performance named North Yorkshire Council as the best performing council in the North of England and in the top three nationally. This is testament our council's continuous efforts to seek the best value for the residents of our county. High productivity and providing that value for money that helps protect our frontline services. This is a tremendous accolade for a council not quite 3 years old.

At our last members seminar, we had a presentation on Corporate Parenting. Not many members know that on being elected, they become corporate parents to over 600 children in the authorities care and to all the cohort of young adults that have left care. The assistant director advised us to "Bake in" corporate parenting into everything we do. Little did she know we would take her so literally and that the following Saturday a couple of corporate parents had already arranged to bake cakes with a group of our care leavers in Scarborough. The logo on my pinafore read "This kitchen is seasoned with love" and it certainly was. Opportunities for our care leavers can be limiting, and in reality, it takes a whole community approach. We have a group of volunteers making them quilts and I have had a couple of simple offers following the baking session. I would ask that you bear this group of young people in mind when opportunities arise in your community. I certainly found it to be a rewarding experience and admit to being a very proud corporate parent.

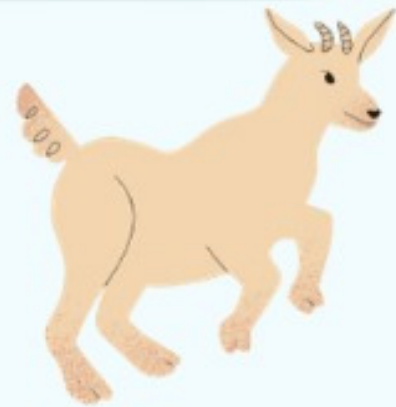

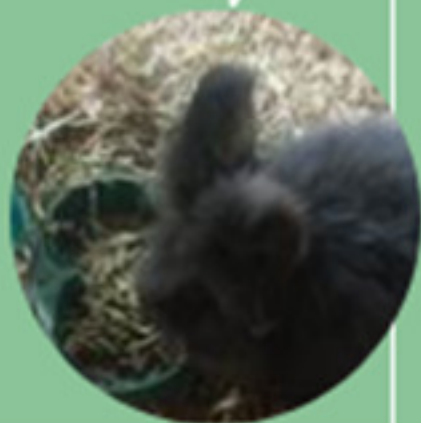

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

*An occasional series from a local birder
and sound recordist.*



Xmas now seems a distant away ... Christmas Day presented itself with a rather grim present ... found a dead tawny owl in the hedgerow ... completely unmarked ... looked as though it had been clipped by a passing car ... even in its moribund state it was a beautiful creature ... added to my knowledge ... owls have tube eyes ... they are fixed in their sockets ... hence all the movement to focus ... it also aids night vision with more rods and all that sort of stuff...



Also got the monograph on purple sandpipers ... another favourite bird ... a denizen of Whitby and Bridlington piers ... *Calidris maritima* ... *Calidris* = grey coloured water bird ... *maritima* ... Latin of the seas ... they make one of the longest journeys from their breeding Stations around the North Atlantic and the Arctic Ocean ... from Canada to Russia ... for a single species much is made of comparison and contrasts with its fellow family species members ... also a useful example of using a helix protractor to measure the progress of incubation

while the egg is floating in a beaker ... just let your imagination run wild on that one ...

The parasitic disease trichomoniasis which causes lesions in the throat preventing feeding ... initially found in greenfinch and chaffinch ... is occurring in goldfinch ... the rspb has stopped selling flat bird tables and is making people aware of the regular cleaning of feeding stations ... Visiting the patch has been somewhat curtailed ... though different routes and time changes have yielded some fun ... the tit family seem to be getting active ... coal ... great ... blue ... and long-tailed ... song thrush in song ... have heard greenfinch singing ... and one valuable edition ... a pair of little owls ... they are extremely vocal ... initial call is like a cat meow ... if you get close to a nest ... their conversations sound like cats purring ... get too close to a nest with fledglings and either bird will go out of their way to verbally and loudly scold you ... add to the list ... pink-footed geese and red kites ...

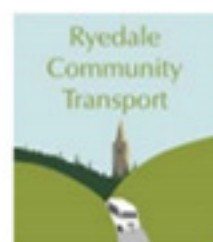
