# Warbler

### A View from County Hall



At our March executive meeting, we debated the possible acquisition of Resolution House, the old Scarborough Building Society building near Morrisons off the A64. This would allow us to rationalise council property in Scarborough and Malton whilst still maintaining two front facing public offices in Malton and Scarborough town centres.

There were clearly many influences that came out during the debate, including the condition and suitability of the present buildings being used, their possible future use, but importantly, the impact it would have on residents. Increasingly residents use online access to council services, and so although a modern energy efficient building would be a great benefit, not everyone chooses the electronic option and so there is still a requirement for a face to face option. Given the remoteness and spread of the Wolds, residents of Foxholes, may find Resolution House easier to access than Ryedale House whereas residents of Wharram would probably favour Malton. It's been a huge job assessing all the property assets now the responsibility of the new North Yorkshire Council. These are very diverse and range from the Harrogate Conference Centre, Milton Rooms and Harlow Carr Gardens to small toilet blocks and a Cliff Lift at Whitby, many inherited in very poor state of repair.

Following the executive meeting, we had our full council meeting and again, reference was made to the Wolds as 19 further Community Governance Reviews were brought forward across the vast NYC footprint. I highlighted lessons Learnt from the very first CGR which was Kirby Grindalythe and Duggleby. It was astounding that of the 19 submissions from parishes, only 4 had responses from more than 10% of residents and 13 had less than 5% of residents responding to the questionnaires. The responses highlighted a need for greater understanding of the process and better communication. Councillors raised a need to balance statutory compliance with cost balance and where possible to give more support to failing parishes before they got to the stage of a CGR.

The work our Parish Councils undertake is valued and appreciate, I would urge residents to support your councils and perhaps consider putting yourselves forward when vacancies arise.

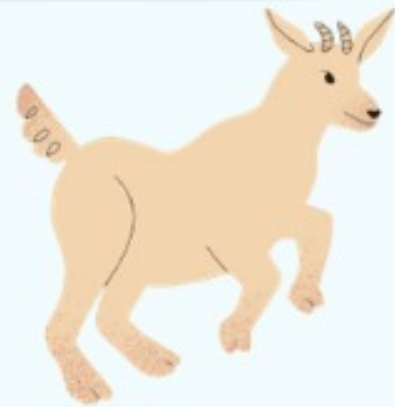

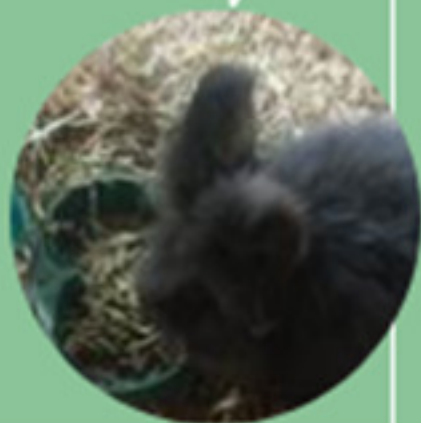

Many thanks to a local resident for access to his garden and pond ... over quite a few nights have had microphones and a drop rig out ... from 20:00 to 06:00 ... the main objects of attention are frogs and toads ... some nights there has been plenty of orchestral manoeuvres in the dark ... other nights ... not much ... plenty of by-products ... a close singing song thrush from 05:30 onwards ... a few recordings of tawny owls as they move around their habitat ... also one very early motorcyclist imagining he was at

the Isle of Man TT ... bless ...

If you are near Sledmere house ... do visit one of the outbuildings housing the photograph gallery ... this contains the work of Elise Thomas ... she passed away at the age of 17 following a road traffic action ... she leaves a wonderful legacy of birds and animal images ... exhibiting her talent ... patience and passion ...

A walk round Wycombe lakes produced at least eight chiffchaffs ... buzzard ... reed bunting and a bird which is on the red list ... a willow tit ...

On the patch ... disturbed two red kites and a herring gull foraging on road kill ... barn owls are out and about ... Mrs M ... lucky enough to see two ... quite strange to see them hunting through the village ... then again ... why not ..? Groups of Fieldfares are about ... two hopes for the season ... one to hear a curlew passing through the valley ... and to find a long-tailed tit nest ... fingers crossed ..? Plenty of hares about ... maximum number so far is 12 ...

A four month old bar-tailed godwit ... and the power of 5g satellite tag ... it has become the owner of the longest non-stop flight medal ... departed Alaska ... flew continuously across the pacific ... and after 11 days ... 8435 miles ... landed in Tasmania ... the flight was made in 2022 ... a normal ..? Journey for adults ... not so for such a tender waif ... it was given the moniker B6 ... the birds can absorb some of their internal organs and expand their heart and flight muscles ... the godwit was conscious the whole time ... which may sound somewhat peculiar ..?

So here's to the arrival of our summer migrants ...

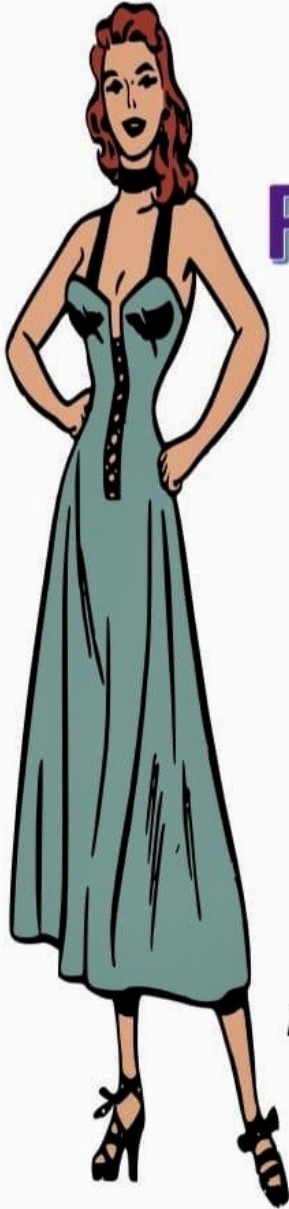

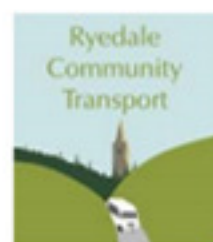
