As residents consider standing before the electorate in May 2027, it's worth familiarising yourself with the constitutional process which in effect is there to protect those holding public office.

In a world that now expects instant rewards, I am often asked why local government is so slow but real growth is often invisibly slow. The strongest leaders are those who keep going without the need for quick validation. In Local Government, at whatever level, we are elected to ensure we consider the impact of decision making on all people within our society, from those well able to articulate their views, to the most vulnerable residents who frequently have little expectation.

What feels like a good decision, can turn out to be a poor one, if that decision has been made without true knowledge and consideration. Discipline is choosing the long-term outcome, even if this may not be the most popular one, taking time to consider what has or hasn't worked in the past to move us safely into the future. So, the next time you look at your council and think there "isn't a conclusion in sight" and they are making "such a fuss", I hope you will remember the onerous duty of public decision making.

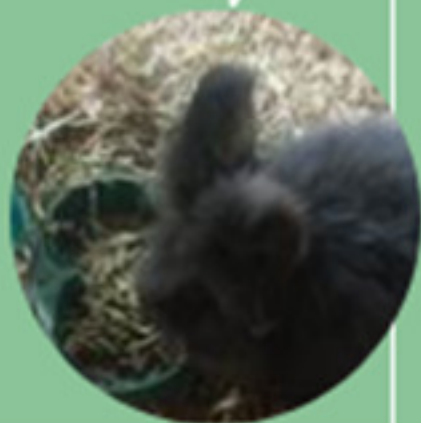

*An occasional series from a local birder
and sound recordist.*



For a number of years have participated in the British trust for ornithology's BBS ... the Breeding Bird Survey ... you're given a tetrad and twice a year ... recording the birds present by song ... call or visual ... it takes about an hour and you also have to record the weather and land usage ... it is different and hopefully adds to the national picture of the fortunes of our avian population ...

At the same time through the door arrives the BBS survey results for 2025 ... it does not make for good reading ... as usual ... long term free fall down trend for turtle doves

... yellowhammer ... lapwing ... also willow tit ... marsh tit ... chaffinch ... bullfinch ... even blue tit and great tit are red listed ... for the plus list are red kites ... stock doves ... and little egret ...

On all things surveying ... it is 20 years since the last bird atlas ... it has been announced that there will be a bird atlas for 2027-2031 ... details to be announced autumn 2026 ... surveying to commence 1st November 2027 ...

A walk round Wykeham lakes lifted the spirits ... in a small area there were 12 willow warblers ... five chiffchaffs ... three blackcaps and three garden warblers ...

The patch has been keeping my attention going ... with barn owl ... willow warbler ... two chiffchaff nests ... hours of sound recording going on there ... lesser whitethroat ... whitethroat ... blackcap ... no garden warbler as yet ...

Back to playing bowls after a few years absence ...

Sledmere is probably a rare place in having the chance to watch and hear curlews circulating ... occasional lucky to have them arriving with fledglings in what passes for a car park ... the other day a ball of screaming swifts was engaging along with ... buzzards ... pied wagtail ... a calling little owl ... and four greylags tanking along ... my team mates are fairly accommodating when one of their members is totally distracted ... or just shake their heads ...

Details of the survey currently being conducted of the Mosaic of the Ascension in St Andrew's Church?



Our church is usually always open for services, to visitors and for private prayer as well as to experience the wonder of our James Redfern altarpiece, Clayton and Bell and Burlinson and Grylls stained glass windows and the breath-taking Salviati designed Ascension Mosaic. This is of national importance with nothing else on this scale in the UK. At the moment the church door is locked and will remain so for the next few weeks, whilst we carry out a thorough condition survey of our beautiful Salviati Mosaic of the Ascension.

We have been advised that an urgent survey of the Mosaic is required to determine the work that needs to be done and to identify out what is causing this problem. At the moment there are lots of views and opinions about what is required, but the survey will provide us with a definitive answer. For example, is the pressing problem rising damp because of a drainage issue? is the damage to the mosaic because of a structural issue causing cracking and movement of the wall behind the mosaic? is it a problem with deterioration of the mortar used to fix the glass mosaic to the walls? How fast is the deterioration? It could be a combination of a number of these issues and currently we do not know how long a timescale we have in order to preserve this mosaic.

We are delighted that **Calibre Conservation** are carrying out this survey work for us.

This survey is being conducted with the generous support of the **Yorkshire Wolds Heritage Trust** as well as using monies raised by our own fundraising efforts, enabling us to move forward with what is the first phase of the Salviati-Mosaic Conservation and Preservation Programme. Without the support of the YWHT it would have taken us many months or even years of fundraising to raise the whole amount.

This phase will provide us with a baseline view of the overall condition and deterioration of the mosaic today, as well as a definitive view of the work required to conserve the mosaic, for the benefit of future generations.

The proposed thorough condition survey including a close visual inspection of the mosaic's surface, materials (mortar, tesserae, and surface coatings) and setting wand will also check for signs of movement, damp, or deterioration, and assess the surrounding environment for any factors that could affect its long-term preservation. The 3D model and orthorectified imagery will provide an invaluable and detailed record of this beautiful and unique mosaic, which will be essential for its long-term preservation and any future conservation work. Following this survey, we will know what the issues are as well as the risks and areas requiring urgent attention. This together with a prioritised order that we need to tackle them in and the timescales we have to sort them out in future phases of the Programme.

ANDYSMANCLUB run peer-to-peer support groups for men aged 18+ going through storms in their lives, every Monday at 7 pm excluding bank holidays. Clubs are free to attend with no registration required.

The group was founded after the death by suicide of Andy Roberts. Andy gave no indication to his family that he was suicidal, as a result, his brother-in-law, Luke Ambler, and mother, Elaine Roberts, founded ANDYSMANCLUB in the hope that men who struggled to open up had a safe space to do so.

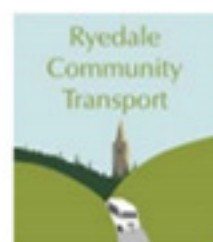
The first ANDYSMANCLUB session ran in Halifax in 2016, with 9 men in attendance on the night. The groups follow the same model they did on the first night and are now available in hundreds of locations nationwide, stretching from Plymouth to Aberdeen. Following on from the COVID-19 pandemic, ANDYSMANCLUB created an online function via Google Meet. This follows the same model and enables men who cannot leave their home due to a variety of issues to join sessions. In the long-term, the charity aims to have a location within 30 minutes travel of any man in the UK.

There are local groups at Pickering, Scarborough and Malton.
