A View from County Hall



This month, North Yorkshire Council reaches its third anniversary, and a reflection on the considerable work undertaken in just three years would seem appropriate. Rolling eight authorities into one has required us to work consistently around the county.

Reviewing the disparity of policies and charging for a broad and diverse range of services including support for children and adults, Public Toilets, Leisure Services and Waste Recycling to name but a few. NYC staff have worked tirelessly to embed new structures, build new teams, create new policies, deliver on key projects and cement our position as a new, high-performing authority.

Since April 2023, strong performance has been maintained across many service areas against the backdrop of considerable change and financial challenge. NYC has -

- Achieved an outstanding judgement for our Children Services.
 - Ranking third nationally for Adult Social Care services by CQC at the time of inspection.
 - Secured £40 million of investment to transform leisure services across the county
 - Approved plans to deliver a minimum of 500 new council homes by 2029, and over £40 million invested in existing homes.
 - Embedded a new waste recycling model, allowing more waste to be diverted from landfill.
- Progressing key transport projects critical to the region.

In the years ahead, local government across the country will be faced with increasing financial challenge. North Yorkshire has been dealt an increasingly difficult position, following changes to national policy. Previously in 2024, the Rural Services Delivery Grant was removed by Government, resulting in a £14 million per year loss to the Council. Further loss of almost £20 million per year in core government grant is expected via the implementation of Fair Funding, a move which does not look particularly "fair" to North Yorkshire as it fails to adequately account for the additional costs incurred in delivering services in rural areas. The cumulative impact of these changes, coupled with demand pressures in social care and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), cannot be overstated. As a result, more difficult decisions lie ahead.

The move to a unitary authority through Local Government Reorganisation has enabled us to seize economies of scale and build a solid foundation for the Council to continue its strong record of service delivery. It is of note that almost 70% of the Council's proposed savings programme can be attributed to this reorganisation and for that we have to be thankful.

MenoChef **RECIPE**

CANNELLINI, LEMON AND ROSEMARY DIP WITH CRUDITES

Bean dips are a great source of plant-based protein, fibre, and essential fats. Cannellini beans particularly contain a wealth of B vitamins, as well as iron, potassium, and zinc. Rosemary may help to boost cognitive health, improve mood and reduce inflammation. Extra virgin olive oil is a rich source of antioxidants and anti-inflammatory fats, that are beneficial for brain and bone health.

30 mins Serves 4 as a snack

PER SERVING:
220 kcal / 30g carbs / 10g protein

INGREDIENTS

400 g cooked cannellini or butter beans, well-drained.
(Reserve a few beans for garnish)
2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
1 tbsp fresh rosemary leaves
1 clove garlic
1 lemon juice and zest
½ tsp cayenne pepper
salt and pepper

Your choice of veg eg:
2 carrots, ½ cucumber, 1 pepper,
6 radishes



In a bowl, add beans, oil, lemon juice and zest, and garlic. Add a little salt and pepper. (Reserve a few beans back for decoration.)
Blend until smooth.
Taste and adjust seasoning if necessary.
Serve dip into a bowl, top with a few beans, a drizzle of olive oil, cayenne pepper, and a few rosemary sprigs.
Chop the veg into strips and arrange on a plate around the dip.

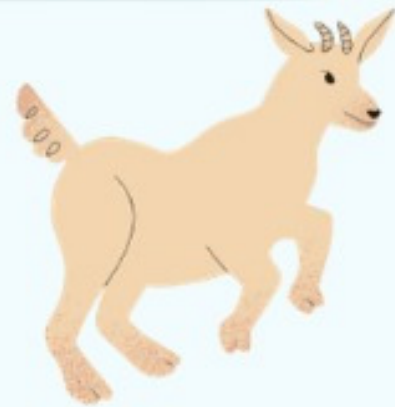

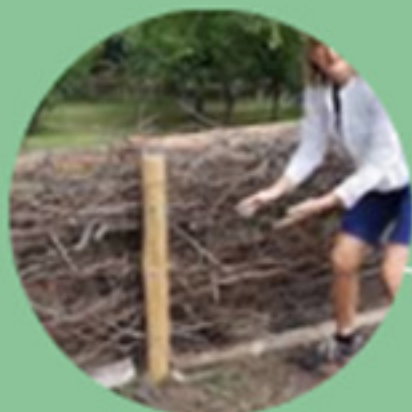

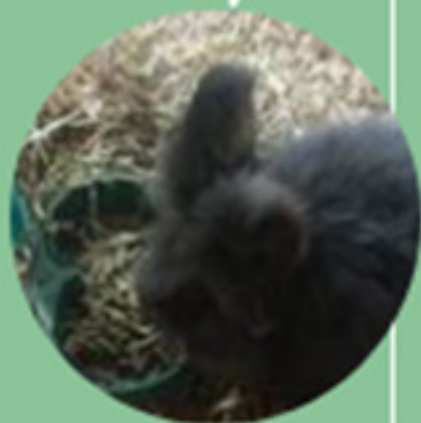

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

*An occasional series from a local birder
and sound recordist.*



Have been spending quite some time sound recording chiffchaffs ... have at least three pairs on the patch ... they are extremely active ... the name of chiffchaff sounds rather mundane ... the variation in their song is quite interesting ... some speed up ... slow down ... hitch kick sounding like two birds ... some chaff before chiffing ... occasionally they sing their song with a willow warbler flourish ... and like the wren they positively pulse with the effort of singing ... their tail wag is a good characteristic ... luckily at times you can get really close to their daily routines ...

Other migrant arrivals include just recently ... yellow wagtail ... whitethroat ... willow warbler ... blackcap ... swallow ... house martin ... hopefully swift ... lesser whitethroat ... and garden warbler to follow ...

Patch birds have included ... two barn owls ... buzzards ... and a red kite which has been around for some time ...

Lists are always interesting ... so the list for red kite nest contents has included ... cuddly toys ... sunglasses ... a tennis ball ... skipping rope ... being patriotic an England football flag ... mr w Shakespeare recorded such behaviour in the winter's tale ... 'when the red kite builds, look to lesser linen' ... clothes line pilferers ...

And for something rather different ... in America there are a group of woodpeckers called sap suckers ... they drill rows or ladders of holes ... sap wells ... they then return to drink the oozing sap ... it is considered that this maybe of importance during the period of gaining energy to start nesting ... so the point is ... there are a number of articles now showing that great spotted woodpeckers also exhibit this behaviour ... who knew ..?

ANDYSMANCLUB run peer-to-peer support groups for men aged 18+ going through storms in their lives, every Monday at 7 pm excluding bank holidays. Clubs are free to attend with no registration required.

The group was founded after the death by suicide of Andy Roberts. Andy gave no indication to his family that he was suicidal, as a result, his brother-in-law, Luke Ambler, and mother, Elaine Roberts, founded ANDYSMANCLUB in the hope that men who struggled to open up had a safe space to do so.

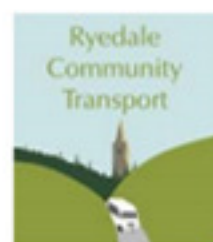
The first ANDYSMANCLUB session ran in Halifax in 2016, with 9 men in attendance on the night. The groups follow the same model they did on the first night and are now available in hundreds of locations nationwide, stretching from Plymouth to Aberdeen. Following on from the COVID-19 pandemic, ANDYSMANCLUB created an online function via Google Meet. This follows the same model and enables men who cannot leave their home due to a variety of issues to join sessions. In the long-term, the charity aims to have a location within 30 minutes travel of any man in the UK.

There are local groups at Pickering, Scarborough and Malton.
